PARENT CONTRIBUTIONS

School Council endeavours to keep all levies and payments as low as possible. In 2009, the Parent Contribution for curriculum materials was \$100 per child per year. School Council will aim to keep the contribution at approximately this level for 2010. Details about payment will be issued with 2010 booklists early in term 1, 2010.

Parents eligible for Educational Maintenance Allowance are advised that the EMA payment to the school is used to provide program materials for their children and, as such, can offset the parent contribution. Contact the office if unsure of your eligibility.

EDUCATION MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE (E.M.A.)

Parents with a current Commonwealth Health Care Card or Pension Card will be eligible to apply for the Allowance of \$221 per child per year (2009 E.M.A. amount).

This allowance is made by the Government to assist parents with school expenses - clothing, books and materials, camps and excursions, etc - and is paid in two half yearly instalments. HALF payment is made directly payable to the school and HALF goes directly to parents. Parents will be informed via the Newsletter when they can apply. Forms will then be available from the office.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Parents will be able to view and order school uniform items at the Parent Information Session or on enrolment.

Price Lists will also be available.

School uniform articles can also be purchased from our School Uniform Shop.

School uniform is compulsory.

Sunsmart hats are to be worn by all children in term 1 and term 4.

ENROLMENT PROCEDURES

* Preliminary Enrolment of children starting school in 2010 can be made any week day between 9:00am and 3:30pm at the main office.
* Parents are requested to call at the office and leave the following information:

No formal paperwork is required for preliminary enrolment. We ask all parents to ensure preliminary enrolments are completed by Friday 23rd October to ensure your child's place.

* When formal enrolment is taken, it is essential that parents bring with them:

1. Immunisation Certificate. This indicates if children are immunised or not and is available from The Australian Childhood Immunisation Register (phone 1800 653 809). Please Note - no other form of immunisation status can be accepted.

2. Birth Certificate or a Passport. This will provide proof of date of birth. Only sighted originals can be accepted as proof.
